

Keeping the Spirit Alive Forever

If there is one thing that Aggies are known for, it's keeping our traditions. No one knows that better than John Q. Allen '93 who keeps the Spirit in the form of more than 500 pieces of Aggie history from yearbooks to photos from 1892 to original Corps brass. Those lucky enough to have seen the travelling exhibit have been treated to a history preserved like no others in the form of yearbooks covering almost the entire 20th century.

In 1895, Lawrence Sullivan Ross was still president of the Texas A&M College, when several Battalion editorials called for the creation of a yearbook. That first yearbook contained a "Public Explanation" for its creation: "Olio will serve both as a memento of our college days for future years and as a memorial of us to the classes which may follow." The Olio was a one-hit wonder, and when the second yearbook was

The collection is a natural extension of the work John does for A&M. While at A&M, John was a proud member of Company L-1 and Parson's Mounted Cavalry, the only active organized cavalry unit still surviving after WWII. John has served as President and program director for the Deep East Texas A&M Club. As an area representative, John facilitates communications between the Association of Former Students and the former students in his area. And, as a Corps recruiter, John seeks out students and shares his stories, rich in history, leadership and heroism. This collection is just one more way John gives back to A&M.

"I don't do it for myself," says John. "It's for staff, professors, alumni who are commissioned war officers. For the brave people serving from Texas Rangers to WWII soldiers to the Spanish American War to Iraq. For the first person to fly into Desert Storm. For a friend of mine who was killed on duty. For the seven Congressional Medal of Honor winners from the University. I do it for the military tradition."

TEXAS A&M RELEASES 2014 CONFERENCE FOOTBALL SCHEDULE

"One year from today, August 21, 2014, the SEC Network will be launched, marking an historic day in the almost 80-year history of the Southeastern Conference," said SEC Commissioner Mike Slive. "One week later, the SEC Network will kick off the 2014 football season with a conference game between Texas A&M and South Carolina scheduled for Thursday, August 28 in Columbia, S.C."

If there was any doubt left as to how the SEC felt about Texas A&M, that coffin was nailed shut with those words. When the 2014 schedule was officially announced, many A&M fans were giddy, and with good reason. Maybe they were thrilled about a primetime Thursday night game to kick off the college football season and the SEC Network. Maybe it was the confirmation of a Thanksgiving day matchup with LSU at Kyle Field, which had been rumored for a while. Maybe it was seeing Ole Miss on the home schedule for the first time. Whatever the case may be, the Aggies now know when and where their conference games will be played next year.






was contacted, an anonymous donation was made, and Tara was informed that her Ring was finally within her reach.
