


Howdy from the President



Shaping the Future One Paw at a Time



The Texas A&M University College of Veterinary Medicine & Biomedical Sciences, established in 1916, is one of only 31 Colleges of Veterinary Medicine in the United States and Canada. To date, over 6000 Aggie veterinarians proudly serve our state, our nation, and the world in countless ways. Many changes will be shaping the future of veterinary medical education and veterinary medicine in the future, and Texas A&M's College of Veterinary Medicine & Biomedical Sciences is determined to help lead the way. So it is with pride that we share some of the wonderful things going on at the CVM.

Living with Inspiration

Take a short stroll through the Veterinary Teaching Hospital and you'll see that there's no shortage of inspiration at Texas A&M's College of Veterinary Medicine & Biomedical Sciences. Chastity and Vonn's story is just one of many:

On August 16th, near Millican, a mother and son pit bull wandered in search of water. They had been badly beaten and burned, and it didn't appear that they would live long. Despite their injuries, Cristi Wuthrich coaxed both dogs into her car and transported them to a College Station vet, who called the Aggie Small Animal Hospital's critical care unit to evaluate the puppy. Knowing it was going to be an expensive endeavor to treat him, Dr. Jimmy Barr, a clinical assistant professor at the college, cautiously agreed to take on the case.

The vets believe that the puppy, Vonn, was doused in lighter fluid, set on fire, and left for dead. His burns covered 60 percent of his body, so they gave him only a 50 percent chance of survival. Yet despite obvious pain and emotional torture, Vonn endured and was their happiest and most determined patient. His will to live was simply inspiring.

Through the Capper and Chris Save the Animals Fund, established in 1995 by Capper and Terry Thompson to provide financial assistance to pet owners who cannot otherwise afford lifesaving procedures and care for their animal, the college raised funds for Vonn's costly care. When the media told stories of Vonn pick-pocketing breakfast burritos from Dr. Barr's lab coat and his love for scrambled eggs, the public responded, donating more than \$8,000. After meeting Vonn, Jackie and Ron Whitley committed to covering the rest.

Having just started a new job as director of development, Chastity Rodgers was drawn to Vonn. She found herself visiting daily and updating others about his cheerful demeanor and miraculous recovery. With everyone's support, Vonn healed much faster than expected, and he was ready to find a forever home after only six weeks at the Small Animal Hospital. As the one person who had visited Vonn daily, Chastity was the obvious choice. Vonn was her "welcome gift from the College of Veterinary Medicine."

Vonn has his own Facebook page, and Chastity jokes that he needs an agent to keep up with his "public" demands. But she knows "when the story has faded from the limelight and it is just us, he will be my constant reminder of the wonderful things happening every single day at the College of Veterinary Medicine for animals and the people that love them. I am blessed to be a very small part of this team. It's definitely worth the three feet of sleeping space – or more – I have given up at night!"

Operation New Horizons

In April, the Texas A&M Veterinary Emergency Team participated in a large-scale, multi-agency emergency response training exercise designed to prepare the team for future deployments responding to animal issues during a disaster. For many, animals have become true family members,

and the ability to reunite an injured animal with its human companion and to provide a resource to first responders who previously were not able to help with injured animals, only humans, is a focus of the VET team.

Operation New Horizons allowed the VET to train alongside Texas Task Force – 1, providing key veterinary support to their search and rescue canines. The VET not only practiced responding to potential injuries, but provided important physical exams and hydration during the exercise. This assistance allows the search and rescue canines to stay in the field longer and potentially save more lives.

The VET also works with the Texas Animal Health Commission during emergencies, and this exercise allowed participants to practice planning and inter-agency communication so that they can be prepared to address animal welfare concerns together when deployed in the field. Often, a surviving pet is the only remaining link to the time before a disaster. Being able to reunite a pet with its human companion can make a huge psychological impact on both.



The Houston A&M Club has teamed up with Jessica Sullivan, a 4th grade teacher at McFee Elementary School in the Cy-Fair Independent School District as part of No Excuses University, giving students a glimpse of what their future could hold with a college education. Jessica plans to use Texas A&M, its stories, and traditions in different aspects of her curriculum to help her students build, not only a love for the idea of going to college, but to push them to think beyond the walls of the elementary school and into their future.

McFee is a Title 1 school in Katy, Texas, with over 1100 students in grades prekindergarten through fifth grade. This year, McFee's administration challenged its

teachers to adopt a four-year university or alumni organizations and partner with that organization to bring the college spirit to the classroom, sharing the dream of building a successful educational destination beyond high school.

The plan is for each classroom to be decorated in the university's colors and for the students to experience the school's unique spirit. In Jessica's case, that means lots of Aggie Maroon and includes learning the yells, songs, and traditions of the school we hold so grand. To start off the school year, the HAMC and PSC donated sports posters, pens, pencils, pennants, and more to Jessica's 4th Graders.

Jessica chose Texas A&M because she loves the Aggies. "The tradition, school spirit, and students are beyond compare. The life lessons that are engrained in the traditions will be proudly taught in my 4th grade classroom." Jessica's husband, Larry Sullivan '12, was in the Fightin' Texas Aggie Band and Jessica fell in love with Texas A&M from the very start. Claiming to be an Aggie at heart and hoping to soon wear the Aggie ring, for Jessica: "There is no greater place to be than Aggieland."

Houston Food Bank Engineering Project



Each week, the Houston Food Bank feeds 137,000 different people, so an efficient system is key to the program's success. This system is well known to the Houston Aggie Volunteers, who volunteer their time every first Tuesday of the month. To that end,

Dr. Georgia-Ann Klutke of the Texas A&M Industrial-Systems Engineering Department has agreed to work with the Houston Food Bank to develop a more efficient system. This spring, Dr. Klutke's students will take on the task of making the Houston Food Bank more efficient as part of a new class project.

This project is not unique. Several years ago, the IE-S Department helped Elves & More make substantial improvements to their Holiday bike assembly process, energizing their volunteers and increasing their productivity. As a follow up to that project, Elves & More invited the IE-S students to come up with a design to modify a standard bike to accommodate disabled children. The resulting kit costs about \$200 and uses off-the-shelf parts, instead of the typical \$1000 or more.



The Texas Capitol Vietnam Veterans Monument 3415 Project needs our help locating families of those Texans who made the ultimate sacrifice in Vietnam, so that their stories and personal effects can be preserved.

The Monument will stand as a permanent honor to all Texans who served in the Vietnam War – serving as a permanent memorial to the 3,415 Texans who never came home. The 3415 Project



will individually honor each Texan who died in service to his country in Vietnam by creating a set of two dog tags for every hero, each personalized with a name, branch of service, rank, date of loss, and Texas hometown. One tag will be kept for educational display; the other will be entombed in the Monument during the groundbreaking ceremony on the Capitol grounds on 25 March 2013. A public roll call will be held on 24 March 2013 at the LBJ Presidential Library Auditorium in Austin.

Backpack Buddy Delivery Service



Each day, many children who rely on free or reduced-price lunches at school go hungry at night and on weekends. The Houston Food Bank's Backpack Buddy program works to fill that gap. On Fridays, at participating schools, children take home child-friendly, nonperishable, easily consumed and vitamin-fortified food. Unfortunately, for the program to

work, the backpacks have to make their way from the Food Bank to the schools for distribution.

The Backpack Buddy program is nothing new to the Houston Aggie Volunteers, who spend the first Tuesday of each month at the Food Bank, occasionally putting together backpacks. So it's not surprising that when CAMP Volunteer Tara Rollins '01 shared Kujawa Elementary's story with CAMP co-founder Freddie Wong '69, the Backpack Buddy Delivery Service was born.

Kujawa Elementary, where Rollins works, used to participate in the program until about two years ago, when they were forced to drop the program due to budget cuts. The program hung on for a bit, until the Food Bank relocated and the school's nearby food pantry stopped making deliveries. Undeterred by these setbacks, Tara and Freddie rallied the Houston Aggie Volunteers to take on the task of picking up 32 backpacks and delivering them to the Kujawa students each Friday.

A week after first announcing the BBDS to the Reveille Club, seventeen volunteers had already signed up to help Kujawa, and a week later, the first delivery was made. Since then, the BBDS has added "luggage tags," with the HAMC logo on one side and space for the student's name on the other, allowing each backpack to be easily identified.
