Makes approximately 3 cups of mix. For a great holiday gift, divide into 1 cup portions and give with a mug.







Joe E. Ramirez, Jr. '79, Brigadier General, USA (Ret.)

On Monday, December 14th, Brigadier General Joe Ramirez, once again, joins the Houston A&M Club for lunch at the H.E.S.S. Club. You've no doubt read his bio on the Corps website, but this is your chance to meet the real man, the myth, the legend.

Brigadier General Joe Ramirez is a native of Houston, Texas and is a graduate of Texas A&M University, where he was a member of the Texas Aggie Band in the Corps of

Cadets. He received his commission in the United States Army Field Artillery from Texas A&M in 1979 as a Distinguished Military Graduate.

During his 31 years of military service, General Ramirez commanded soldiers around the world and served in leadership positions in various joint and operational commands. He was the Deputy Chief of Staff for United States Central Command during Operations Iraqi Freedom and Enduring Freedom, and was the Deputy Division Commander for the 2nd Infantry Division in the Republic of Korea. His most recent assignment was Deputy Director for Strategy, Plans, and Policy for US European Command in Stuttgart, Germany.

General Ramirez holds a Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education from Texas A&M (1979); a Masters Degree in Management from Webster University, St. Louis, Missouri (1993); and a Masters Degree in Strategic Studies from the United States Army War College, Carlisle, Pennsylvania (2000).



His numerous military awards include the Distinguished Service Medal, Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit, Korean Defense Service Medal, and the Parachutists Badge.

Wishing a Happy Veterans Day to two of my favorite veterans: my Dad, MSG Joe E. Ramirez, and my son, CPT Jason Ramirez. Both combat veterans - my father in Korea, where he was shot 5 times and was a POW for 33 months, and my son in both Iraq and Afghanistan. BOTH great Americans. Honor our Fallen Aggies with a Wreath for the Holidays


On December 12th, Houston Aggie Volunteers and students from the Caring Aggies Mentoring Program are once again laying wreaths on the

graves of our fallen Aggie heroes for the holidays. Among those wreaths will be at least 40 marking the final resting places of those beloved Aggies who made the ultimate sacrifice.

An estimated 15,000 people will pass through the gates of the Houston National Cemetery to pay their respects and place more than 60,000 wreaths. Our heroes will be honored with a ceremony complete with a 21 gun salute, echo Taps, a bagpipe troop, and a Coast Guard fly-over. For an entire month, the gardens of stone will be wrapped in holiday elegance. Then, in January, an estimated 1000 volunteers will remove all traces of the season as a new year dawns.
